

Children designed their own menus for the event, offering a wide selection of Spanish food such as: stuffed mushrooms, stuffed peppers, croquets, serrano ham, chorizo, manchego cheese and bread made by the children.

Willow class have been learning all about the Egyptians. To support this work they have visited Cliffe Castle in Keighley and participated in an Ancient Egyptian Mummification workshop where children learned all about how the Ancient Egyptians prepared their dead for the afterlife by taking part in a step by step mummification and handling real Ancient burial goods.



Willow class also held their very own Egyptian Museum and stalls at their parents event.


