The standard progress score for all pupils nationally is 0.0.

Summary – All progress scores are positive apart from Non-Pupil Premium middle prior attaining group for maths. PP pupils performed significantly better than non-PP in all measures. Although the class as a whole made the least progress in maths, pupil premium pupils made significantly more progress than their non-pupil premium peers.

National Comparisons (all pupils): 75% reading/78% writing/76% maths/78% EGSP/64% combined.

Summary: The % of Wycliffe disadvantaged pupils achieving the expected standard in the 2018 end of Key Stage tests was lower than for other pupils at Wycliffe. It was also lower than the non-disadvantaged pupil group nationally except in writing where Wycliffe disadvantaged pupils out-performed the national figure by 7%. No Wycliffe pupils achieved the higher standard combined score.

National comparisons:- 76% reading/68% writing/75% maths – (2017 data).

Summary – All Wycliffe's figures for both PP and Non PP groups were below national. PP children performed less well than their non PP peers in all subjects except Reading and no PP children achieved GD in any subject. The combined score for PP children was significantly below that of the Non PP Group (-8%).

Summary – Pupil premium pupils performed better than Non-PP in the Phonics Screening and were also 2% above national comparisons.

Summary – Non PP Pupils performed better at the end of EYFS than PP Pupils. Both cohorts performed less well than national figures (based on 2017 data).
