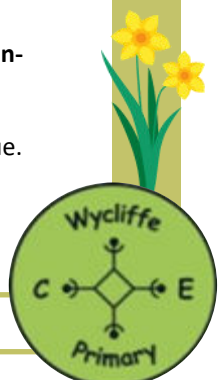

|  | Purple card if behaviour has been particularly impressive – for behaviour only – not academic work. It could, for example, be really super following of our school expectations |
|  | Gold.... above green but one step left for the perfection that we call purple. |
|  | Most children start the day by being good to be green. |
|  | Yellow card to be turned after verbal warning has been given and not acted upon. This can quickly go back to green when better choices are made. |
|  | Red card - sending to SLT. Tougher sanction such as loss of privileges, phone call home. You can be jumped straight to red when Zero Tolerance behaviours occur. |
