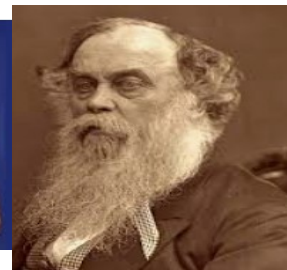

- Queen Victoria was crowned Queen in 1838. She was Queen until 1901. The next King was Edward VII, then George V, then Edward VIII, then George VI until our Queen now.
- Queen Elizabeth II was crowned in 1953. She is the longest reigning English monarch (King or Queen) in history.
- Victorian schools were very different to our school today– they were much stricter. The cane was used as a punishment. At first only rich people could go to school.
- Queen Victoria was married to Prince Albert
- Lots of important things were invented in the Victorian times for example; the underground railway, electric lights, the telephone, the bicycle, a gas engine, moving pictures, xrays and antiseptic.
- Life in Victorian times was different for people depending on your class– how much money you had.

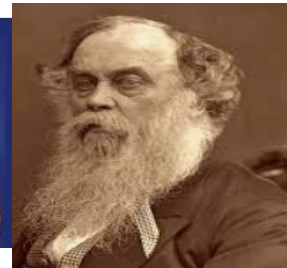
