


Home/School Agreement 2022/23





The school will:

- work towards every child reaching their full potential
- promote high standards of work and behaviour
- treat each child equally as a valued member of the school community
- celebrate and fulfil our 'Vision and Values Statement'
- ensure that each child has access to a broad and balanced curriculum, underpinned by Christian Values and respect of all faiths
- inform families about the curriculum to be covered each half term

- hold 2 parent/pupil/teacher meetings annually to discuss each child's progress
- provide at least 1 written progress report for each child annually
- arrange an appointment if parents wish to discuss any issues
- let families know of any concerns they have which may be affecting their child's work behaviour or well-being
- contact external agencies as required in line with the school's safeguarding policy
- contact the family if there is a concern regarding a child's attendance or punctuality. Persistent absence of below 90% will be followed up with a 4-week improvement plan
- respect our motto 'All Different, All Equal'
- support families in any way it can, as appropriate

- ensure our child attends school regularly and respond to school's efforts to improve attendance

- inform the school of the reasons for any lateness or absences

- notify the school about any changes in circumstances that may affect our child's learning and well-being
- support the school in maintaining good behaviour and discipline, underpinned by Christian Values and respect of all faiths
- embrace the school's 'Vision and Values Statement'
- support our child's learning at home through ensuring they are heard to read regularly and that they complete their homework
