
Our big question this term is: Did Guy Fawkes start the Great Fire of London?



# English

Using the tune 'London's Burning', we will write our own poetic pieces to describe the events of the Great Fire of London. After that, we will write a non-chronological report filled with facts about the Great Fire of London.



HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

Our learning continues to be centered around our big question 'Did Guy Fawkes start the Great Fire of London?' Now we know our geography of London and the details of the events that caused the Great Fire, we are going to focus on how we know all about the fire and the reliability of the sources we have.

This will include learning about Samuel Pepys and his diary. We will immerse ourselves in what London was really like in 1666. Most importantly, now we know Guy Fawkes did not start the fire, we will learn about who he really is and what his place in history is.
