
Maths

This half term, we are focusing on multiplication and division. We learn about common factors and multiples, prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers as well as how to multiply divide a range of numbers. Our final topic will be negative numbers where we will learn how to count through zero.



HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

Our learning in History will continue to be all about World War One. We will be investigating what led to the end of WW1



Science

Our Science lessons this half term will be all about living things and their habitats. We will be learning about the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird. We will also be describing the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals. We will consider the work of David Attenborough and Jane Goodall and discuss why their work has been so important to living things and their
