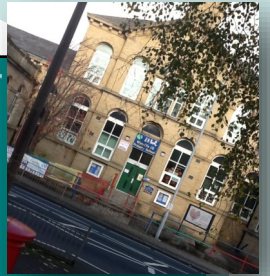

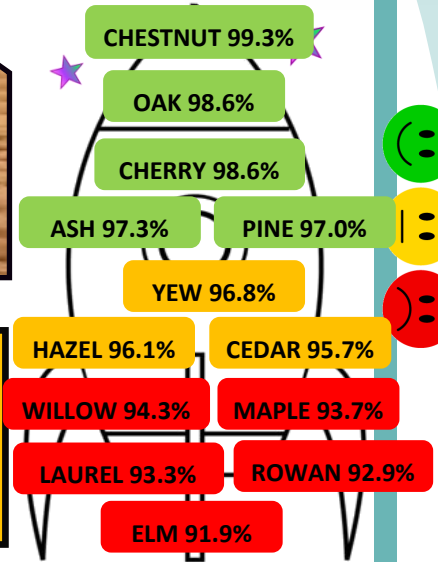

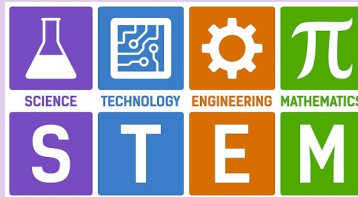
B'FAST & OUT OF SCHOOL CLUB BOOKING
