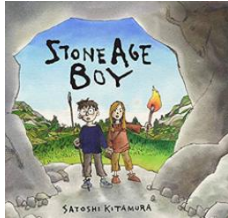

Who lived here first?

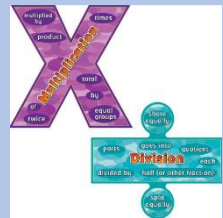


English

Using the entertaining yet informative text 'Stone Age Boy', we will observe the daily life of Om. After becoming experts in how to live during this era, we will be writing a narrative of the story from the perspective of the boy, a factual recount and a poem.

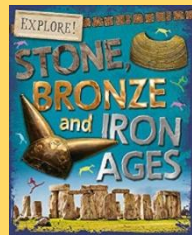
MATHS

In Maths, we will focus on multiplication and division, learning the 3, 4, and 8 times tables, problem-solving, multiplying 2-digit by 1-digit numbers, and exploring length and perimeter.



HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY

In History this term, we will be working hard to find an answer to our big question, "Who lived here first?". In order to answer this, we will be exploring changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. We will be looking at everything from late Neolithic hunter-gatherers and early farmers to technology and travel in these eras. Our journey will finally end in the Iron Age learning about hill forts, tribal kingdoms, farming and art and culture.



Science – Animals, Skeletons and Nutrition

This half term in Science, we will be focusing on Biology. We will explore the human and animal skeletons, learning about different types of skeletons and the vital role of the spine.



PE

Monday and Thursdays. Please come in your P.E Kit on these days and your jewellery off or covered with tape. We will be learning dance and yoga.



ART

This half term, we will be learning about cave paintings and how to make our own paint from natural ingredients. In addition to painting, we will use charcoal to draw lines, shade and blend like an 'early human'. Our end point will be to create our own cave drawing in the style of the Lascaux caves using chalk and charcoal.



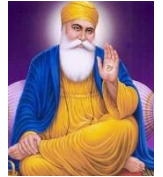
PSHE - Relationships

Our big question in PSHE is, 'What are families like?' We will explore family life and how we care for each other. There will be a real focus on wellbeing as we learn strategies to help us manage common emotions.



RE

Our big question in RE is, 'What is it like to be Sikh in Britain today?' We will learn about Sikhism as a faith, the importance of the Gurus and where Sikhs worship.



Music

In Music we will be learning some songs about the Stone Age and looking at the structure of the songs including the verse, chorus and bridge sections. We will also be learning more about the language of music through playing the glockenspiel and introducing notation.

Computing

In Computing, we will be programming sounds. This will involve using Scratch to select motion, sound and event blocks, which will then be used to create our own programs featuring sequences of different sounds.



French

In French, our topic will be 'Animals'. Learning key vocabulary related to animals is where our journey will begin, with a real focus on oracy and pronunciation. This will be followed by writing some simple sentences about animals.



Reading

Please keep reading at home and bringing books and reading records into school EVERY day. Record any reading that you do at home in the reading record. In school, we will read with your child at least once a week. We would love it if you could read on a daily basis and where possible do the online quizzes on Accelerated Reader.
